Congratulations to all our students who participated in PSSA Mountain Biking competition last Friday at Glenrock. From all reports it sounded like a tough competition and that Belair students shone!

Thank you to those parents that were able to join us for the P&C meeting last week. It is always lovely to have the opportunity to discuss and share school initiatives and feedback about what we do and what we can do better. One of the areas we are working on in the School Improvement Plan is strengthening connection with the community. As a staff we will work on ways to open avenues to increase that connection, and I will keep you informed on ideas we are able to brainstorm and implement heading into Term 2.



At the P&C meeting I also presented a realigned version of the School Improvement Plan as a means of consultation of this school community document. Moving into 2024 a decision has been made to realign the School Improvement Plan into two strategic directions instead of three strategic directions to refine processes and make the plan more manageable. The intention to do so, will not compromise the integrity of the initial plan which was developed in consultation with community. Strategic Direction 3 initiatives will be encompassed within Strategic Direction 1 and 2 as activities. Moving forward we will evaluate progress against the plan using the latest version of the School Excellence Framework, Version 3. I have included a table showing the changes between the original plan and the realigned version further in the Newsletter.

Thank you to all our community for your support of the Easter Raffle. At the time of publishing the newsletter, I believe the profit of the raffle is more than \$4000. That is fantastic!!

### Gate Access after bell

### Communication protocols- review and update

Secretary of the Department of Education, Murat Dizdar, has issued directives to allow staff the permission to switch off from non-emergency communication outside of school operating hours to support staff wellbeing.

Four principles have been developed for all teaching staff and communities to help enable clear expectations for digital communication:

- safeguard employee wellbeing
- demonstrate leadership in relation to establishing, promoting and maintaining digital communication practices outside of school operating hours
- context matters
- promote respectful workplaces and communities.

Our current Belair Communication Protocols comply with these 4 principles, yet require a minor adjustment to the times emails are sent as set out below (from original times between 7:30am to 6:00pm):

### **Email**

**Purpose:** Sharing of information, including:

- Communication for various student groups
- Financial invoices
- School Newsletter
- Parent / teacher communication







**Protocol:** Staff will endeavour to respond to parent email enquiries within 48 hours (on school days and during business hours)

• Parents are requested when emailing outside the hours of **8:00am and 5:00pm**, to address the email to the school account rather than the teacher's personal departmental account. These emails will be forwarded to staff each morning.

Here is the next instalment in how parents can support the reading development of their children at home.

### Phonics How does phonics contribute to reading success?


Phonics builds on phonological awareness. During phonics lessons at school, children learn to connect the sound or phoneme to the letter of the alphabet or group of letters that is used to represent it.


### How can families help with phonics learning at home?

- Teach children to write their name. Use a capital letter at the beginning and lower case for the rest of the letters. Write it for them and let them trace it, copy it, make it from play dough or draw it in sand.
- Point out words and letters when reading together. 'There's the letter M, it says mmm for Mummy. Can you see the S that says sss for Sam?'
- Encourage children to find the letters in their name or the names of family members and in other places such as books, signs, product packaging and shop windows.
- Point out different fonts, different ways to write the same letter, when reading and in your local environment.


### **Class Visits**

With NAPLAN taking quite a bit of my week last week, I only got to visit one classroom. What a visit it was! I continue to be blown away each and every week with the amazing learning that I get the pleasure to witness. 1A have been reading factual texts and learning how authors arrange their information so that the reader is able to comprehend what they are reading. Students had been examining texts about whales and using these as a base for their own research. The use of a scaffold encouraged students to organise their information under subheadings. 1A used the information they had read, to write their own sentences for the subheadings 'Appearance' and 'Diet'. Way to go, 1A!






















Check out Lily's writing that she completed independently after reading her book about whales during her reading activities. That smile shows just how proud she was of her hard work! Go Lily!

### Transition to High School in 2025 (for current Year 6)

Complete your form

by this date:

Online – 10 April

(Wednesday of Week 11)

To enrol your child in Year 7 for 2025, you will need to complete an Expression of Interest for Year 6 to Year 7 transition. The Expression of Interest (EOI) lets you indicate which school(s) you would like your child to attend in Year 7.

Please note: If a child has two parents who live at different addresses the parent who is in zone for the nominated high school should complete the application eg. The parent in

zone for Kotara HS. Only one application per child please.

The EOI process is available online – **and will close very soon**. After you submit an EOI and it has been assessed, your child will be offered a place at a high school.

If your child will not be attending a NSW Government high school next year, please let us know by completing a Placement Not Required form.


If you are unsure whether they will be attending a NSW Government school (eg. you've applied for a private school, or you are moving interstate), we ask that you still complete an EOI and follow up with your school once a decision has been made.

The online process will guide you through your options and collect the information required to make the process as smooth as possible.

Year 3 students will sit a **pilot** Opportunity Class Placement Test. Year 5 students will sit a **pilot** Selective High School Placement Test.



# Heading to Sydney Airport?

Easter is one of the busiest periods for Sydney Airport. Allow extra travel time and plan ahead.

To avoid delays, consider catching the train instead. Download the **Opal app** to keep informed of any public transport changes and alerts. If you are driving to the airport, check **Live Traffic NSW** before you leave home.

### Screen habits to improve sleep

### Did you know?

School aged children need between 9 & 11 hours of sleep each night to help them play and learn during the day.

- Avoid using screens for at least one hour before bedtime. Wind down by reading or playing quiet games
- Keep tablets, mobile phones and other screen devices in a dedicated place outside of the bedroom every night
- Encourage your child to connect with friends during the day, rather than messaging or playing games at night


