Greetings Everyone,



### **COVID-19 Protocols:**

Just a reminder that the following restrictions still apply:

- \* Parents are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events. Kiss and drop pick up and arrival practices remain in place.
- \* All visitors and external to school providers must adhere to relevant hygiene, distancing and safety protocols as follows:
  - a. **ALL visitors** must report directly to the office (this includes visitors to the uniform shop on Monday mornings).

# Year 6 2021 Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Program

Belair acknowledges the educational value of digital devices and online services in supporting and enhancing educational outcomes and student wellbeing. 'Remote Learning' changed the way we use technology on a daily basis and it is now even more deeply embedded in classroom learning at Belair Pubic School. Therefore, we need our students, especially our older students, to have access to reliable technology at school and at home. We also need to ensure that our students are adequately equipped to use these devices actively as creators, designers and makers, not just consumers, before they move onto high school.

In 2021, Year 6 students are asked to bring their own mobile computing device to school for learning purposes. This device should be a laptop/notebook/foldback device with an integrated/attached mechanical keyboard, as described in the recommended device specifications later in this document.

When students begin high school, they are required to bring their own devices. These devices are used extensively to access, complete and submit subject content. We would like to better prepare our students for high school by introducing a structured BYOD program at Belair Public School for Year 6 students. Students will become more confident, capable and skilled in using laptops for learning purposes.

Through this program students will learn how to: manage their own device and troubleshoot connection and technical issues, manage their own online learning, develop high-level technology skills, develop essential digital note taking skills and the knowledge necessary to engage appropriately and safely with the online world. They will become savvy digital learners and their transition to high school and then the 'real world' of further studies or the work force will occur in a more seamless fashion.

#### Rationale

Belair Public School is committed to deliver an innovative, challenging curriculum that values the role of technology in learning. Belair Public School BYOD program provides the opportunity for our students to develop and enhance the skills necessary to be engaged future-focussed learners. Through learning experiences, students will endeavour to become self-directed learners, critical and creative thinkers and collaborative team players.

This document provides advice and direction to Belair Public School parents and students using a BYO Device to access the Department of Education wireless network. While the policy is intended to be as comprehensive as possible, there will inevitably be some situations that are not specifically covered. In these circumstances, the Principal or their delegate will decide the appropriate course to take in the circumstances.

#### **Objectives**

- 1. To facilitate and promote the ability of all students to bring a device to school in Year 6 for use in their education.
- 2. To provide a safe environment for students to further Objective 1.
- 3. To ensure a reasonable standard of device compatibility.
- 4. To enable students to use technology to further their learning, independently and in structured lessons.
- 5. To provide a basis on which Belair Public School teachers can continue to tailor lesson delivery so that students can use their devices in class to enhance learning outcomes.
- 6. To facilitate the opportunity for students to engage in technology to build future-focussed learning skills.

#### **Device Specifications**

The device must meet or exceed the device specifications recommended by the school (listed below). Some suggestions of types/brands/models are offered to assist parents.

The school strongly recommends that parents and students choose a Windows-style laptop/notebook/foldback device to ensure that the BYOD Program maximises their learning experiences. Tablets like Apple iPads, Samsung Galaxy or other

Android tablets are not acceptable devices under this BYOD agreement. These devices do not have the ability to cater for the variety of technological applications which will be delivered in the classroom.

All BYO devices must have a physical keyboard with separate keys for A-Z and 0-9 which physically move when pressed. Convertible devices (a laptop that splits to become a tablet and keyboard separately) must have a physical keyboard attachment with this same functionality - separate keys which physically move when pressed.

#### Please note:

Windows 10 'S' version is NOT recommended. Windows 10 'S' version restricts software installation to only applications obtained through the Microsoft Store. To install applications normally from an executable file, the full version of Windows 10 is required. Windows 10 'S' version is often found on the lower priced laptops.

It is recommended that BYO devices have the following protections:

- Insurance against loss or breakage;
- A protective carry case;
- Anti-virus / anti-malware software installed.


#### **Early Stage One Presentation Day**

On Monday all students across the school spent a learning session in the grade above. To make this possible, Year 6 returned to where it all began will a fun packed session in the Kindergarten classrooms.

















Finally, I would like to acknowledge the incredible staff who do an amazing job everyday as they guide and support our students in and out of the classroom.


































































### Year 6 Mini Fete - Wednesday 9 December
