Facebook in the next few days.


A touching moment of the ceremony was the outgoing prefects passing their leadership duties onto the incoming prefects and the announcement of the 2021 School Captains.

Thank you to the P and C for giving every student an ice block on the last day as a congratulations for being so resilient over a tough year.




COVID-19 Protocols:

Just a reminder that the following restrictions still apply:

* Parents are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events. Kiss and drop pick up and arrival practices remain in place.







* All visitors and external to school providers must adhere to relevant hygiene, distancing and safety protocols as follows:

- a. **ALL visitors** must report directly to the office (this includes visitors to the uniform shop on Monday mornings).
- b. Office staff will ask you to sign a form and take you through hygiene protocols
- c. A visitor's sticker must be worn while on site (this will confirm you have followed the protocols at the office for staff members on site)
- d. All adults must maintain physical distance from each other (1.5m) while on site and including pick up and drop off arrangements where parents are asked to physically distance outside the school gates.

NSW School Bus Service Change

From **Monday 14 December, Week 10 Term 4,** there will be improvements to Newcastle Transport regular routes and school service timetables. These changes have been made to improve reliability and better reflect congestion and travel times to get students to and from school in the Newcastle Transport area.

While there have been no changes to dedicated school service routes, some minor adjustments have been made to timetables to better reflect congestion and actual travel times to and from schools around the Newcastle Transport area.

Students who use regular routes will also need to check their timetables.














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Stage 1 Report



Our favourite things at school this year were science, maths, free play, English, art, Minecraft, Miss Brown visiting us and our wonderful teacher.



Who roamed around the sandy beaches


"Oh the places you'll go" is another book You may be surprised but it is not about a cook

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
Stage 2

Year 6 held a fun and successful Mini Fete last Wednesday, raising over \$2400 to purchase a gift for the school.


























Stage 3 Report



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
