#### Communication protocols- review and update

Secretary of the Department of Education, Murat Dizdar, has issued directives to allow staff the permission to switch off from non-emergency communication outside of school operating hours to support staff wellbeing.

Four principles have been developed for all teaching staff and communities to help enable clear expectations for digital communication:

- safeguard employee wellbeing
- demonstrate leadership in relation to establishing, promoting and maintaining digital communication practices outside of school operating hours
- context matters
- promote respectful workplaces and communities.

Our current Belair Communication Protocols comply with these 4 principles, yet require a minor adjustment to the times emails are sent as set out below (from original times between 7:30am to 6:00pm):

#### Email

**Purpose:** Sharing of information, including:

- Communication for various student groups
- Financial invoices
- School Newsletter
- Parent / teacher communication

**Protocol:** Staff will endeavour to respond to parent email enquiries within 48 hours (on school days and during business hours)

• Parents are requested when emailing outside the hours of **8:00am and 5:00pm**, to address the email to the school account rather than the teacher's personal departmental account. These emails will be forwarded to staff each morning.

## Mrs Jardine – Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction

Here is the next instalment in how parents can support the reading development of their children at home.

#### Comprehension How does comprehension contribute to reading success?

Comprehension or understanding what we read is the whole aim of reading. Good readers comprehend in different ways depending on the book, article or website they are reading. Some of the ways readers comprehend include:

- predicting before reading and as they read
- making connections between what is being read and the reader's past experiences of books, life and the world
- asking questions about what is being read. What is this character going to do in this situation? Why did that character do that?
- monitoring meaning, checking predictions, confirming them, correcting them, re-predicting and rereading
- creating a mental summary of key parts of the story or information
- creating a mental picture of characters, setting
- inferring, interpreting and reading 'between the lines'

## Selective High School and Opportunity Class Pilot

#### Computer based test pilot for selective high school and opportunity class placement tests

You may have heard that the selective high school and opportunity class placement tests will become computer-based tests in 2025.

The Department of Education is calling for students to participate in a pilot of the computer-based placement tests to help them prepare for this change.

It's free and **open to students in Year 3** to sit the pilot opportunity class placement test and **students in Year 5** to sit the pilot selective high school placement test.

The pilot will be held on Saturday 22 June 2024 at test centres in Sydney, Newcastle and Bathurst.

Parents of eligible students are invited to submit an expression of interest for their child to participate in the pilot at the University of Newcastle, Callaghan.

Expressions of interest are open between 26 March – 12 April 2024.

This is a good opportunity for students to take a practice test ahead of the computer-based placement tests in 2025.

Computers will be provided at the pilot test venues for all participating students. Students cannot use their own personal computers.

# As this is a pilot of the computer-based tests participating will not result in placement in a selective high school or opportunity class.
